WE ACCEPT SPAY/NEUTER VOUCHERS FROM THE FOLLOWING:

PAWS Of Bremerton: 360-373-7043. Applicants must go in person to their office in Bremerton: 3306 Perry Ave, Bremerton, WA 98310. Provides financial assistance for spay/neuter and low-cost flea treatment.

PAWS of Bainbridge and North Kitsap: (206) 842-2451. Provides low-income families with emergency financial aid for veterinary expenses. Our service area is Bainbridge Island, Suquamish, Kingston, Hansville, Indianola, Poulsbo, Silverdale.

P.A.C.K. : Apply via their website at **packgives.org**. Provides financial aid to pet owners in three primary categories: seniors, low-income/no-income, and the unhoused.

Humane Society of Pierce County: Apply online. Vouchers available for **residents of Pierce County** only.

Rez Animals: (253) 370-6392. For enrolled tribal members, or residents of the reservations of Chehalis, Nisqually, Skokomish, Squaxin Island, or Shoalwater Bay Tribes.

Concern for Animals SENIOR Vouchers: (360) 456-8176 (**Seniors** in Mason, Lewis, Grays Harbor, and Thurston Counties). Covers up to \$300 of spay and neuter costs.

PALS (South Sound Seniors) (360) 586-6181 (**Seniors 60+** in Mason and Thurston Counties) Covers up to \$500 of spay and neuter costs.

Concern for Animals Non-Routine Care: (360) 456-8176 (Lewis, Mason, Grays Harbor, and Thurston counties only): Apply by phone. Provides financial assistance for **NON-ROUTINE or emergency vet care**.

Rainier Animal Fund: 844-723-8387 rainieranimalfund.org Provides essential veterinary care to families who cannot afford the full cost of treatment.

Washington State University College of Veterinary Medicine Good Samaritan Fund: Program that provides financial support by treating animals at WSU Veterinary Teaching Hospital in Pullman, WA.

Paws of Bainbridge Island (Bainbridge & North Kitsap County): pawsbink.org/ 206-842-2451 or 888-558-PAWS (7297). Apply by Phone. Provides low-income families with emergency financial aid for veterinary expenses. Help with pet food and free or low-cost spay/neuter.

Four Paws Lifeline (Tulalip, WA): fourpawslifeline.org. Financial assistance to pet owners for **emergency** vet care. Funds are limited, and they may only be able to contribute a portion of what is needed.

Cascade Animal Protection Society: 253-863-8004. Assists with veterinary care. Must have applied for Care Credit (see below).

NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Care Credit: 1-800-677-0718 A credit card for veterinary expenses. **HSMCWA does not accept Care Credit at this time.**

Scratch Pay: 855-727-2395 Payment plan for medical financing. Please check to see if your veterinarian participates.

iCare Financial: (<https://www.icarefinancialcorp.com/veterinary-financing-program>) Please work with your vet to apply online. Immediate funding for your pet with no credit check. Payment plan for veterinary bills. Your vet and/or clinic that your animal is being treated at must apply on your behalf.

VCA Animal Hospital: \$25 first-time vet exams for new clients who sign up online at some VCA locations. vcahospitals.com/pacific-avenue

Red Rover: 916-429-2457 In addition to general veterinary assistance, this organization also has great lists to search for local, breed, and condition-specific options, as well as fundraising suggestions.

The Pet Fund: 916-443-6007 Provides assistance with veterinary care. All applicants are required to contact The Pet Fund by phone before applying for funding. **Non-emergency** only.

Frankie's Friends: 888-465-1921 Has a general fund for assistance with veterinary costs, as well as several different funds for particular circumstances: Hope Funds for discounted services at select Blue Pearl Animal Emergency Hospitals, JLACF fund for cancer treatment, and Bond's fund for eye care.

Pet Assistance, Inc: petassistanceinc.org Financial assistance for independent vet medical needs. This organization will **not** cover services at a "chain" hospital (or corporate-owned hospital) or emergency situations.

Rose's Funds for Animals: rosesfund@aol.com "We will financially assist, to the best of our ability, pet owners and Good Samaritans who have an animal with a good prognosis for a healthy life but are at a financial loss."

Friends and Vets Helping Pets: friendsandvetshelpingpets.org/need-assistance/. Provides funds for curable (lifesaving, not life-prolong) diseases. Financial aid is intended as a supplement to family resources.

Brown Dog Foundation: browndogfoundation.org Offers guidance and referral to low-cost alternatives for pet care.

The Mosby Foundation: themosbyfoundation.org. **Non-emergency** financial aid for dogs. Cannot anon-emergencyagnostics or core vet care (vaccines, spay/neuter.)

Magic Bullet Fund: themagicbulletfund.org Fundraising assistance for **cancer treatment.**

Live Like Roo: livelikeroo.org provides financial assistance to help cover costs related to cancer treatment. To be eligible, a **pet must have a confirmed cancer diagnosis.**

Harley's Hope Foundation: harleys-hopefoundation.org. Assistance for low-income pet parents when medical issues arise.

STARelief and Pet Assistance: <http://starelief.org/our-programs> Provides life-saving pet food and veterinary care, emergency boarding and foster care to pets whose caretakers are struggling with financial hardship.

Onyx and Breezy Foundation: onyxandbreezy.org/grant-application.html Provides funding to support individuals facing medical hardship, dogs of veterans suffering from PTSD, food, medicine, supplies, and more. Requires approval/denial proof of Care Credit.

Hope Mending Hearts: hopemendinghearts.net/grant-process/ Grant for **urgent medical care**. Must apply for Care Credit to be eligible.

Paws 4ACure: paws4acure.org A one-time grant for veterinary care up to \$500. Requires applicants to apply for multiple grants/assistance.

Diabetic Cats in Need: dcin.dreamhosters.com/get-help/ Helps with cost of diabetic medical supplies for cats.

Tripawds ASAP: tripawds.org/2016/12/tripawds-asap/ Assistance for dogs and cats who require amputation surgery.

Pets of the Homeless: petsofthehomeless.org A list of resources for displaced families with pets.

Help a Pet: <https://www.help-a-pet.org/apply.html>. Provides financial assistance for low-income pet owners who are unable to afford the cost of veterinary services, medicine, or medical supplies. Due to limited funding financial assistance can only be provided once per pet.

Pet Assistance Inc: petassistanceinc.org/financialaid. Provides financial assistance to long-time pet owners for their emergency care. Does Not assist with routine care, ongoing illness, costly diagnostics. (New or recently acquired pets do not qualify).
